

Monster Phonics

We follow the Monster Phonics Scheme.

- Term 1 teaches the National Curriculum Year 1 graphemes (tch, ve, ay, oy, a-e, e-e, i-e, o-e, u-e, u-e, ea, ea, ir, oe, ou, ow) plus revision of Reception digraphs and trigraphs.
- Skills focus on blending and segmenting of decodable words alongside the reading and spelling of the Year 1 CEWs and the first 100 HFWs. Suffixes ed, s/es, ing, er and est.
- This is in preparation for the Government Year 1 Phonics Screening Check in the Spring Term.

Homework

- Homework is provided each Friday and is due back the following Thursday. Children will receive a Dojo/sticker when they have handed in their homework.
- Homework provided: Spellings and English related.
- Autumn - Read and learn
- Spring - Read and write
- Summer - write a sentence including the word

Reading

- Children are expected to read daily at home. They can change their book as often as required.
- Other texts (magazines/comics/instructions/recipes)
- We have a rainbow incentive reading chart. When a task completed, it is recorded on a rainbow chart. There is a reward for each colour achieved. Dojos, bookmark, certificates etc. Once full, they choose a book.

How to support your child at home

- Reading regularly at home is **essential** and discussions about what they read
- Learning weekly spellings
- Encourage them to talk about what they have learnt.
