


Behaviour and Rewards

1. Warning - This can come in the form of a look, tap on the table or a gentle reminder (saying your name).
2. Reminder - This comes in a spoken form to let you know that the behaviour has not improved and it has not gone unnoticed.
3. Consequence - This comes in the form of a yellow card and going to speak to a member of SLT - Mr Leeman, Mrs Bache, Mrs Pettifer or Mrs Roberts.

You can get a yellow card straight away if your behaviour is deemed serious enough.

3 yellow cards in a week, will result in a red card.
