



English: Non-chronological report on Jane Goodall and poetry for performance.

Maths: The children will learn about measurement. They will learn about units of measure including mm, cm, m, ml, l, g, kg, seconds, minutes and hours.

The children will also be investigating fractions including a half, a quarter and three-quarters.

The children will also learn the names and properties of 2D and 3D shapes.

Science: The children will be exploring living things and their habitats. They will also be looking at animal adaptations and how to care for the environment.

Computing: Children will create an animation. They will follow an algorithm, plan a code to create an algorithm and use their code to make an algorithm.

PE: The children develop skills required in athletic activities such as running at different speeds, jumping and throwing.

Art: Children will investigate maps as a stimulus for drawing which they will develop into a 3D artwork. We will also develop ideas and craft skills when print making. They will learn to evaluate against a design brief.

Music: They will read and clap rhythms in different ways and create patterns to perform a group composition.

History: The children will be learning all about the monarchy. They will also be investigating castles and the features of them.

Geography: The children will learn all about the coastal areas of the UK and what it is like to live there.

RE: The children will be investigating what it means for God to become human. They will make connections between beliefs about right and wrong and their belief about their God.

PSHE: Children will be learning all about citizenship and economic wellbeing, investigating where money comes from.
